I wish to go to Lapland

Alice, 7 neuroblastoma

At just seven vears old, Alice has lived most of her life in and out of hospital following a lifealtering cancer diagnosis. Whisked away to a wintry wonderland. Alice's Lapland wish offered much-needed respite for her and her family.

At just eighteen months old, Alice was diagnosed with a neuroblastoma, a rare type of cancer, when a tumour was discovered in her abdomen. "Her tumour was the size of three satsumas," explained mum Jen.

Treatment for Alice's cancer was intense, with Alice spending much of her childhood in and out of hospital undergoing chemotherapy. On top of this, Alice still has to take multiple daily medicines and treatments to rid her body of the chemicals that her tumour emitted: "Still to this day we are trying to get rid of the chemicals in her body."

For Alice, Christmas offers time away from tedious doctor appointments and the thought of constant medication. As Mum told us, "She loves the pretty lights and snow. Christmas for Alice means sparkly lights, family fun and getting the decorations up and of course presents!"

It's no surprise then that Alice's wish was to go to and experience Christmas in Lapland!

Whilst on the wish, Alice was able to enjoy thrilling rides with huskies - "Without a doubt that was my favourite part," explained Mum "we were able to steer the huskies ourselves!"

For Alice, her favourite part came when she was able to meet the man himself - Father Christmas. When we asked Alice what her favourite part was, she straight away answered "Santa!" without a moment of hesitation.

The wish gave the family time which they had missed out on during Alice's hospital stays: "One huge thing was to have quality time with her without hospital appointments. Having time away from the medical stuff was amazing."

Our mission is to grant the wish of every eligible child in the UK. To do that we need to find new ways of funding wishes. So, in September 2023, we launched our Community Funded Wishes strategy, where we aim to grant the wishes of 200 children across the UK, purely through communities of volunteers and supporters generating gifts in kind (donations of goods, services and skills) and fundraising. So far, we have granted a fantastic 43 wishes at an average cost of just £70 per wish!

But what's next? We want to grant every eligible wish and to do this we need more wonderful volunteers throughout the whole of the UK. A special community role has been created to tell the stories of our wish children on a local level, inspire people to donate items and services as well as fundraise in their area. We currently have an amazing 52 community volunteers, but we are aiming to recruit another 80 before the end of August.

With a local team of like-minded, passionate volunteers, you could come together to inspire your community to help grant the local wishes that are waiting. This could involve activities such as working together to organise a fundraising event to raise money for local wish children, or approaching local community groups online to donate their services. You will have the full support of your local leader as well as the wonderful Community and Volunteering team, and the role is completely flexible and designed to work around you and your busy life.

I joined Make-A-Wish UK in March 2023 through my employer Disney when they were asking for staff members to become volunteer Wish Makers to help with A Disney Wish - an inclusive wish where children can experience the magic of Disney right here in the UK. Make-A-Wish UK is something very close to my heart, I grew up with cerebral palsy and had multiple operations and procedures growing up. I was given a wish by a different

organisation to go to Disneyland Paris with my family. I know first-hand how much a wish can impact the child when they are going through some tough moments in their life. It also has a huge impact on the family as this may be the only time they can spend time together as a family and create magical memories. So, joining Make-A-Wish UK was a no brainer for me.



After I had completed the wishes for a Disney Wish UK, I asked the team if I could stay on as a Wish Maker. I have now completed nearly 70 wishes and counting. Being a Wish Maker for me is the most rewarding experience to be able to give back. The team have also asked me to be a Community Leader which I will be helping to make wishes happen within my region and I am so honoured that the team has asked me to do this.

Meet Zac

WISH STORIES

For twelve-year-old Zac from Aylesbury, his wish to go to Lapland UK offered him the chance to go ice skating, out of his wheelchair, for what may be the last time.

"Knowing that things like Lapland UK are still possible for Zac and that he can still enjoy days out even though his condition is deteriorating, is comforting to know. It's so hard to find things that are accessible for Zac whilst being appealing to his brothers too, and this was," explained mum Sara. "We now have some lovely memories to look back on. Thank you so much! It makes such a difference in people's lives to have such wonderful experiences."



18-year-old Izzy's life has mostly been centred around her greatest passion: dancing. But when the bubbly teen from Doncaster was diagnosed with B cell lymphoma, dance studios and ballet shoes were swapped for hospital appointments and gruelling treatment.

"Treatment put a pause on that part of her life," said mum Karen as she spoke about the impact chemotherapy had on Izzy's lifelong dream of being a dancer. But after having her wish to see the dancers of The Royal Ballet rehearse at the Royal Opera House, Izzy was able to gain insight into the many career opportunities that the world of dance offers, something she missed out on whilst undergoing treatment.

"We were in shock," explained Karen as she recalled what it was like hearing that Izzy had B cell lymphoma - a fast-progressing cancer that causes the lymphocytes (cells responsible for fighting infection) to no longer fight infection, instead growing out of control. A loss of control was also mirrored in Izzy's life: "She didn't have a chance to make a friendship group in Sixth Form. She couldn't do normal things," said Mum. Following her diagnosis, Karen went into full survival mode, staying by Izzy's side: "Our lives moved round her diagnosis. The full extent of what was happening didn't hit us until it was all over."

This is why Izzy chose to see the dancers of The Royal Ballet rehearse at the Royal Opera House: it would offer her insight into her future career, after being unable to do so during her treatment.

"Dance is her thing, she's been doing it since she was five. It's what she wants to do with her life," explained Mum. On the day of her wish, Izzy and her family were welcomed in through the stage door of the Royal Opera House and into the ballet rehearsal rooms to see a unique behindthe-scenes view of the show they'd see that night – The Nutcracker. The family sat and watched as Royal Ballet dancers Daichi Ikarashi and Viola Pantuso rehearsed for their parts as Clara and Nephew, followed by Joseph Sissens and Mariko Sasaki rehearsing the Sugar Plum Fairy and Prince.

After rehearsals, the family took an extensive trip around the wardrobe department to see the intricate hand-made costumes from the show, from the hundreds of tutus to the Mouse King! The tour ended with a special meet and greet with Principal dancers Sarah Lamb and Ryoichi Hirano, who would be playing the Sugar Plum Fairy and Prince in the show that Izzy would later be seeing. Izzy was then gifted a goody bag that included a signed programme from the evening's show and a pair of signed pointe shoes from Principal dancer Sarah Lamb.

For mum Karen, her favourite part of the wish was simply looking at Izzy's beaming smile as she watched the dancers rehearse: "I could've cried at that point. It was such a special moment."

Izzy now has a wealth of knowledge to dip into when thinking about her future dance career: "It gave me a chance to know that there are other jobs involved in dance. There are other ways for me to be in that area even if I'm not the person on stage." After being unable to do so whilst receiving treatment, gaining insight into the world of dance was much needed for the future dance professional. As Izzy told us: "Sometimes it feels like you've missed out on a lot, a wish can give you something that you've really wanted to do that you wouldn't have been able to do whilst undergoing treatment."

For the whole family, including Izzy's brother Samuel, age 16, and dad Daniel, the wish allowed them to make long-lasting memories after being unable to do so whilst Izzy was undergoing treatment. As Mum said "We were able to all take part in Izzy's world as a family. It brought us all together for a lovely magical day."

"I'm so thankful that people have donated to make wishes like mine possible," said Izzy. "Being in the seats we were in watching them rehearse is something we wouldn't be able to do if people hadn't donated - Thank you so much!"

While Reuben still attends the clinic, he is reaching full recovery stage. However, he has met lots of children during his journey who are not as fortunate as he has been so Reuben and his family joined forces with Niamh to share their inspiring stories to help raise awareness and create magical wishes for other families.
